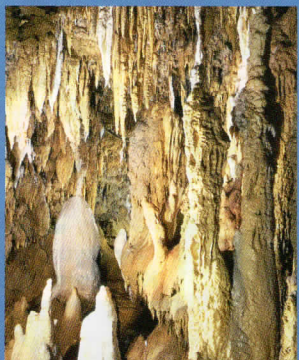

## Map 2 Gyokusendo Caves

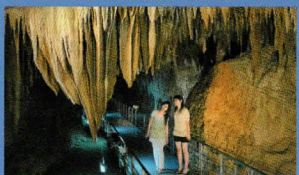
Designated Natural Monument

Beautiful Natural Scenery  
Created Over 300,000 years.

In March 1967, when Okinawa was under American administration, a survey team from Ehime University conducted the first exploration and survey of the Gyokusendo Caves. Then, thanks to the enthusiasm of the young people of the exploration team, the whole cave system was brought to light. Gyokusendo is said to be one of the biggest cave systems in Japan with an overall length of 5,000 meters, with over a million stalactites, the most in Japan. It has become such a well-known tourist destination that there's hardly anyone in Okinawa Prefecture who hasn't heard of it. Currently, 890 meters are open, and the remaining area is preserved for research purposes.

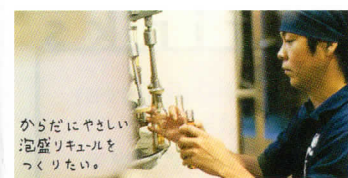
## Map 3 Shopping Center
